## The Ins and Outs of Pick-Ups and Drop-Offs

As many of you know, the start and end of the school day is a very busy time. We understand that many parents and guardians are extremely busy and are in a rush to drop off or pick up their child, and we want those transitions to be as smooth and quick as possible. Unfortunately, we are noticing an increase in traffic infractions that jeopardize the safety of our students – especially our patrols, who do an excellent job every day trying to keep our school community safe. We would like to remind everyone of the following rules that will help everyone stay safe:



- Three point turns are not permitted in streets in front of our schools. Please take a few extra moments and go around the block. At our Matheson location, it would be helpful if all vehicles travelled from east to west (from Powers toward MacGregor). Please plan your route accordingly.
- Stay clear of our bus lanes on Matheson and on Teakwood at the middle school. This is especially important from 8:30-8:50 and 3:30-3:50. We have 7 buses that arrive and leave our school daily. They need the space to drop off and pick up students.
- Watch for red flashing lights and stop signs on buses. Stop means stop!
- Respect the school zone speed limit of 30 km/hour around all of our schools.
- Keep your eyes open! Although the patrols do a fantastic job every day, there are still some crossings that are not monitored. Many of our children are crossing these intersections by themselves. Be aware and be prepared to stop.
- Do not pick up your child or park in or behind staff parking stalls in the back alley behind the Matheson school.
- Avoid Carruthers Avenue if possible. If you do need to use Carruthers, do not block neighbour's driveways or garages, and please move out of their way quickly if you are in the way. Under no circumstances should anyone park on Carruthers and leave their vehicle. (Carruthers Avenue is the street behind the playground at our Matheson campus.)

The school knows that finding parking spots is difficult. Powers Avenue and Copp Street provide parking, as well as the west side of Matheson past the high school lunchroom. We ask that you use these three areas first, especially when picking up your children. We want to keep students safe and maintain good relationships with our neighbours. Your co-operation in this matter is greatly appreciated.
